

Guard against melanoma while on the water

- 1. Over a million new cases of skin cancer occur in the U.S. each year, outnumbering the total of all other cancers combined.
- 2. Annually, over ten thousand Americans die from melanoma, more than one person every hour, costing over a billion dollars. The emotional and physical costs are *incalculable*.
- 3. Less than one third of children are protected from Melanoma at home, school, and at the lake.
- 4. Due to tanning salons, melanoma is the fastest increasing cancer among young women.
- 5. Melanoma is usually detected at home rather than in the doctor's office.
- 7. Due to late detection, men have the highest death rate for melanoma.

The Sawyer County Lakes Forum urges everyone to:

- Avoid excessive direct exposure to the sun between 10 AM and 4 PM.
- Always use a high spf sunscreen.
- Reapply sunscreen every one to two hours or more often when sweating or swimming.
- Wear a wide-brimmed hat, tightly woven clothing, and sunglasses.
- Protect your children. Set a good example for them.
- Seek shade when outdoors. Avoid tanning parlors and sunlamps.
